

The Father's Heart for the Lost

• The Pharisees withdrew from sinners, wrongly believing it necessary on the basis of God's holiness (vv. 1–2)

Prov 1:10-15 My son, if sinners entice you, do not consent...15 do not walk in the way with them; hold back your foot from their paths

Prov 4:14-15 Do not enter the path of the wicked, and do not walk in the way of the evil. 15 Avoid it; do not go on it; turn away from it and pass on.

Prov 13:20 Whoever walks with the wise becomes wise, but the companion of fools will suffer harm

Prov 14:7 Leave the presence of a fool, for there you do not meet words of knowledge

The Father's Heart for the Lost

- God's relentless pursuit of sinners and joy at their repentance indicate that love is one of God's most central attributes (vv. 3–10)
- God lets every person go their own way, but always responds with compassion and acceptance when they genuinely repent before Him (vv. 11–24)
- True followers of Jesus will grow to share God's joy at the transformation of sinners (vv. 25-32)
